## Trip Dossier

### 14 Day Pilbara Reef & Ranges Expedition



**New Easy Camping Small Group Tour - Max 12 passengers**  
**Perth to Broome 4 - 17 May 2019**

#### Itinerary Highlights:

- Fly to the Abrolhos Islands and explore this unique marine area and its abundant wildlife.
- Enjoy a cruise at Monkey Mia, spotting dolphins, dugongs and other magnificent marine life.
- Visit Coral Bay, a small settlement where the coral starts right at the water's edge, and spend the day as you please.
- Experience the beautiful Ningaloo Reef - World Heritage area and one of the world's largest fringing coral reefs.
- Visit Karijini National Park - a vast wilderness area with spectacular natural wonders such as Dales Gorge, Fortescue Falls, Handrail Pool and Oxer Lookout.
- Explore Marble Bar.
- Visit 80 Mile Beach

#### **\*Easy Camping\***

The easy camping concept has been introduced to make the whole camping experience more enjoyable. The camp support crew will travel in a separate vehicle and will have our camp operational when the bus arrives with the group. No more erecting tents, beds or un-packing camping equipment. Just pick up your bag and either spend time exploring the campsite or freshening up and relaxing before dinner.

The Pilbara is fascinating at any time, the wildlife is plentiful and the scenery is spectacular. Green covered hills and refreshing rock pools. The contrast between the red soil against the rocky outcrops are sure to create lasting memories.

The Abrolhos Islands consist of 122 islands, approximately 60 km off Western Australia's coast. The marine environment surrounding the Abrolhos is a meeting place for tropical and temperate sea life. It is also one of the most important seabird breeding sites in the world. More than 90 seabird species have been identified on the islands.

This tour has it all. The Ningaloo Marine Park is one of the world's largest fringing reefs, home to 200 species of hard coral, 50 soft coral and over 500 species of fish. It's a great place to swim, snorkel and enjoy a cruise in a glass-bottomed boat to see the colourful sea creatures.

Karijini National Park contains some of the oldest rocks on the continent with many beautiful gorges and rock formations. The park is also home to approximately 800 plant species. Two small, carnivorous marsupials are endemic to the area, the Pilbara Ningai (Ningai timealeyi) and the Little Red Antechinus (*Dasykaluta rosamondae*). Other marsupials that call the park home include the Western Pebble-mound Mouse (*Pseudomys chapmani*), Rothschild's Rock-wallaby (*Petrogale rothschildi*), Red Kangaroo (*Macropus rufus*) and the Common Wallaroo (*Macropus robustus*).

Join us and discover the spectacular natural wonders of this remarkable area.



## Itinerary

### **Day 1 Perth to Geraldton**

Departing Perth early this morning we start the journey north, passing through the northern Kwongan (sand plain heath) as we head to the Nambung National Park and the Pinnacle Desert. We continue northwards, traveling through Dongara and historic Greenough into Geraldton.

Accommodation: Camp site, Geraldton LD

### **Day 2 Geraldton**

Today's flight to the Abrolhos Islands will provide some spectacular views of the island group. The flight lands on one of the islands where we will have time to explore the abundant wildlife in the area which includes a variety of birdlife. You may also find bottle-nosed dolphins and sea lions.

Accommodation: Camp site, Geraldton BLD

### **Day 3 Geraldton to Hamelin**

We continue northward as we head for Hamelin. This afternoon there will be time to visit Shell Beach and the stromatolites at Hamelin Pool.

Accommodation: Camp Site, Hamelin BLD

### **Day 4 Hamelin - Monkey Mia - Hamelin (Shark Bay area)**

Today we explore some of the natural history highlights that this area has to offer. There will be time this morning to undertake a cruise off Monkey Mia looking for dolphins, dugongs and all the other magnificent marine life that this area has to offer.

Accommodation: Camp Site, Hamelin BLD

### **Day 5 Hamelin to Bullara Station**

An early start this morning, leaving Hamelin we continue our trip towards Coral Bay. There will be time in Carnarvon for a look at the town. We will arrive in Bullara in the late afternoon.

Accommodation Camp Site Bullara BLD

### **Day 6 Coral Bay**

An early start this morning will allow time for those who want to participate in an optional (Own expense) 7.45 am, all day, Whale Shark Cruise. For those who don't wish to join the cruise there is plenty to do:- undertake an optional glass bottom boat / snorkelling cruise over the famous Ningaloo Reef, swim or just do some relaxing and sightseeing.

Accommodation: Camp Site Bullara BLD

### **Day 7 Bullara Station to Tom Price**

Leaving Coral Bay we continue north to Nanutarra Roadhouse which is on the banks of the Ashburton River. We then head east towards Tom Price. There should be a number of opportunities to stop for wildlife sightings during the day.

Accommodation: Camp Site, Tom Price BLD

### **Day 8 Tom Price - Hamersley Gorge - Tom Price**

This morning we drive along the west side of Karijini to Hamersley Gorge. There will be plenty of time to fully explore the gorge and enjoy a swim in its cool waters. Mid afternoon we head back to Tom Price where there will be some free time while the crew restock the fresh provisions.

Accommodation: Camp Site, Tom Price BLD

### **Day 9 Tom Price to Karijini National Park**

Today we travel to the Dales Gorge area of the national park. Our drive will take us past the second tallest peak in WA, Mt Bruce. There will be time here to walk part of the way to the summit and experience the expansive views. The Dales camp ground will be our home for the next two days.

Accommodation: National Park Camp Site, Karijini BLD

### **Vehicle & Equipment:**

Air conditioned purpose built 4WD tour coach with all front facing, mostly reclining, seat-belted seats, power facilities and all the necessary camping equipment. Passengers are required to supply their own sleeping bags and pillows, or a sleeping bag can be hired from us with prior notice for \$55.00.

### **Accommodation:**

Is at a combination of bush camps and campsites.

Bush camps are at locations chosen by the tour guide for their suitability and natural benefits. There are usually no facilities available, other than a long drop bush toilet. We do carry adequate water for washing. Private campsites vary. Some provide full facilities including ablution blocks, other sites only have a long drop toilet.

National Park campsites are operated by National Park managers. They have a mix of flushing or composting toilets, fire rings and clearly defined camping areas. Some provide showers.

### **Meals:**

Meals as per the tour itinerary are included, i.e. (B) breakfast, (L) lunch, (D) dinner and morning tea. There will also be a plentiful supply of fresh fruit available throughout the day. Special dietary requirements can usually be catered for where prior notice is given. Please contact the office if you have a special dietary requirement as a surcharge may apply.

### **Trek Grading:**

We undertake only light / medium bushwalking on most days. In Karijini National Park some extra effort is required on the ascents and climbs in and out of the gorges. All walks are optional and will be able to be conducted at your own pace. There will also be some optional rock scrambling.

### **Weather:**

Our tour has been timed to coincide with the dry season. Days are usually dry and hot with temperatures around the low to mid 30's (degrees Celsius). The nights can be cool with minimum temperatures around 10 -15 degrees Celsius.

### **Clothing:**

A suggested list of items to bring on tour will be included with our pre-departure information. This will be sent to you about one month before departure. Generally, comfortable, casual clothing is recommended. Light shirts and T-shirts are appropriate for during the day and warmer jumpers and jackets may be needed for the evenings. Don't forget your bathers and any snorkelling equipment you may have. Sturdy and comfortable walking shoes are a necessity and an old pair of sneakers or reef style boots which can be worn in the water are highly recommended.

### CANCELLATIONS

In respect of cancellations by a passenger, some tours have specified cancellation times and penalties, this specific information is available on the respective tours, trip dossier. Where no specific cancellation time or penalties are in place the following levies plus any costs charged by other parties involved with the tour will apply:-

#### Where written notice is received

- 61 days or more prior to departure; \$250.00
- 60 - 31 days prior to departure; \$500
- 30 days or less prior to departure 100%
- No refunds are considered from the day the tour starts.

### INSURANCE

We strongly recommend that travel insurance against imposition of cancellation fees, loss or damage to baggage and extra costs arising from injury or illness be effected.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

EQUIPMENT:- Transport by an air-conditioned custom built 4WD tour coach or mini bus which ever is appropriate for the tour. Camping equipment suitable for each tour (except Sleeping bags and pillows) is provided. A second vehicle may accompany the group on tours to remote areas. In the case of breakdown or other unforeseen circumstances effecting the vehicle or guide, the operator reserves the right to substitute vehicles and guides other than those specified, to ensure the operation of a tour.

### GENERAL INFORMATION CONT.

SEAT ALLOCATION:- Seats on tour vehicle are not pre allocated. To ensure all participants get to enjoy forward positioned and window seats we have incorporated a daily seat rotation system.

LUGGAGE:- Please note that due to health and safety requirements luggage on tour is limited to one medium sized, soft sided bag per person. The sum of its length, width and height is not to exceed 140 cm. The maximum weight of the bag should not to exceed 15 kilograms. A small day pack is also permitted. International tours, some island tours and the Kimberley Coastal Cruises luggage limits may vary, please see the respective tours trip dossier for specific weight maximums.

WILDLIFE:- Sighting of birds, or animals mentioned in the itineraries can not be guaranteed as they are wild and therefore free to come and go as they please.

WILDFLOWER DISPLAYS:- Can not be guaranteed as they are dependent on seasonal rains.

### GROUP SIZES

Minimum and maximum numbers apply to all tours. Generally tours have a maximum of 12 passengers. A camp cook and a naturalist leader will accompany camping groups with more than 6 passengers.
